Bunny does well with cats, primarily because she can't see them, and she's fine with other dogs in that she ignores them. She needs prescription eye drops and is prone to ear infections.

She can stay in one place for hours and she's great off leash because she can't see well enough to go anywhere else other than where you last put her. And as soon as she figures out my sliding glass door opens from the left and not the right, she'll be housebroken! Bunny will be the perfect for someone who wants a quiet, dedicated companion.
